JUMP!

It's time to Jump into Fall. This is one of my favorite times of year because of everything that starts up in September. Kids trundle off to school with new clothes and cute little backpacks. The season subtly changes and pretty soon the leaves are ready to change. Football starts up!



Things get going for a new year at church, too. This year, we are calling our time of starting everything JUMP! On the cover, you can see a photo of a young man diving off a land-bridge with nothing but bungee cords attached to his ankles. It takes a lot of guts to do that. It's a dive into the known, but with risk.

What's *known* is that the cords around your ankles also hold you to life and enable a bungee jumper to have quite a thrill. The *risk* is that, you never know what might happen!

The life of discipleship is like that. It's a jump into the *known* – a leap into the life of God in Jesus Christ. It's a leap into fellowship with other people, whose experiences of God will enrich our own experiences of God – and our life with God will also enrich theirs. It's a jump into patterns of life of worship, learning, and the encouragement of spiritual growth.

But the life of discipleship is also a jump into risk, because God is greater than our ability to comprehend, and His life, given us in Christ, always takes us into the risk of *not* knowing what is around the corner; of challenges that will ask more of us than we can ever respond to. You never know what might happen...

There are no guarantees in our life with Christ the way the world *wants* a guarantee –that if we follow Christ all will go well and we'll never have any problems. That's not what Jesus guaranteed us. He gave us guarantees that when we give our lives away, that's when we gain them; that when we are weak, then we are strong; that when we humble ourselves, God exalts us; that we must die in order to live; that we can't earn favor with God, but only receive it as a gift. What mysteries are these!

So jump! Jump into fall. Jump into a place for spiritual growth or service. Jump into God, and bring a friend with you.

For many years, the Children's Ministry team has been reading books, attending conferences, and doing our best to know what components of ministry will best help our kids have a life-long faith in Jesus Christ (this is the purpose statement for CM). As a result, we've been having children in worship this summer as we have learned that is vital to a child's faith. Our team believes that this has been a positive step toward allowing kids to learn how and why we worship from the people that have the most influence on them....their parents! Columbia's staff believes that it is critical to have all God's children worshipping together.

During the early summer, we quickly realized that we do not have the leadership to continue Godly Play. The CM team was disappointed but also realized that children cannot be in a class and in worship with their parents at the same time. Maybe this is God telling us that it is time.....time to welcome the children into worship regularly.

Therefore, this fall our 11:00 offerings will be classes for children Kindergarten and younger and worship for those children in first through fifth grades. There will still be a full offering of classes at 9:30 for all ages.

BUILDING UPDATE

Have you ever wondered why Columbia is considering a major building project now? You're not alone. It's probably the most frequently asked question received by the Building Committee. So really, why now?

To answer this question, let's review what we do know. First, we know the three essential elements of what God is calling Columbia to do. They are 1) helping people *encounter God*, 2) so that their *lives are changed*, and 3) they *are sent* into the world to do God's work. And second, based on congregational surveys and meetings, we know that in order to accomplish this, Columbia needs a church that:

- Has a warm and inviting gathering space.
- Includes a renewed and enlarged worship space.
- Is accessible to all.
- Includes flexible spaces for multiple uses.
- Is modern and updated.

If we look at how Columbia's physical space impacts our ability to do what God is calling us to do, we should be better able to understand why the time is right for a major building project.

Gathering Space...A larger space designed for gathering will provide a warmer, more inviting space in which we will be better able to welcome and get to know visitors and newcomers (as well as each other). It will enable individuals to better encounter God in our community of faith.

Worship Space... Studies indicate that a sanctuary is considered "full" when 80% of the space is occupied. For the majority of our services, Columbia is "full". Those same studies also show that when a church is "full", visitors or newcomers often don't return. By enlarging our worship space Columbia will no longer appear full. We will be "open" and ready to help people enter into life-changing relationships with God.

Accessible to All...This is probably the one enhancement to the church that needs no explanation. Imagine having a church that when you plan an event or activity, you don't have to worry about having it in a location that is easy for all to access or plan on how to move people about safely. Likewise, imagine wanting to attend a class or activity and not having to worry if you'll be physically able to access the room in which it is being held. Need we say more?

Flexible Spaces for Multiple Uses...Columbia currently offers a large variety of classes, activities and small groups through which individuals are able grow in their relationship with God and their church family. Additional opportunities for spiritual growth and encountering God have been identified. Unfortunately the implementation of these new opportunities is often limited or delayed because there are no rooms or space for them.

Updating the church to include more multiple use spaces designed to be easily adaptable for a variety of uses will enable our ministry teams to quit "talking" about what they would like to do and "just do it".

Modern and Updated...Columbia has a long and rich history. Our church has served God and us well. However, after 50+ years we all need a little tune-up...even our church. The building project will include improvements to the building that bring it up to current building code, make it more energy efficient, modernize the classrooms and meeting spaces, and tie all the spaces together with a modern, updated look.

We will not neglect the house of our God. Nehemiah 10:39

It's easy to talk about what this church needs. We've done that for the last several years. The time for prayerful discernment and action is here. Let us follow in the footsteps of Nehemiah. He saw a problem and he was distressed. Instead of talking, he took action. Nehemiah knew what God wanted him to do and he did it.

God is calling Columbia to be a church where individuals are encouraged to enter into a life-changing relationship with Jesus, and find their places in God's work. Now is the time to ensure our building helps us fulfill that mission.
